Leigh Academies Trust the journey so far

- Started in 2008; HQ in Strood, Rochester.
- Currently 31 open academies all within a one hour drive.
- Merged with The Williamson Trust, 1st January 2019.
- 15 secondaries (inc. one UTC), 15 primaries, two special academies.
- Academies contain 12 nurseries and 10 special needs centres, as well as three mainstream satellites for our special academy – inclusive ethos.
- Three 'Clusters' of academies: Central Kent; Medway, Ebbsfleet and North Maidstone; and South East London and North West Kent.
- Roughly 40% outstanding vs 15% nationally.
- 3,500 staff and 22,000 children aged 2-19.




