When it opened in 1957, the school was named after Mr Hugh Christie who was a local farmer, public servant and educationalist. He was one of the founders of the National Union of Farmers and Women’s Institute.

He was a man of outstanding character, integrity and courage. He was awarded the OBE for services to political and public life in Kent. He died in 1962.

A sense of belonging

Leigh Academy Hugh Christie is part of Leigh Academies Trust. The academy is structured to embrace the 'small school' model of learning. This ensures that all students are understood as individuals whilst embracing the facilities and opportunities available within a larger academy context.

All pupils will belong to three colleges as well as the whole academy. The colleges are called Angelou, Attenborough and Coe.

Each College is led by a Head of College (Vice Principal), supported by an Assistant Head of College (Assistant Principal), Head of Pastoral, dedicated student support managers and a college administrator. Pupils will also have an Advisor who they meet every morning. This is a comprehensive Pastoral team who will oversee the safety, attendance and academic progress of all pupils in their respective college by providing outstanding Pastoral care.

The Colleges take part in competitions throughout the year. Pupils are rewarded with 'Merit Points' for upholding the academy values.



Our curriculum

We provide a broad and balanced curriculum, delivered through a culture of high expectations, principled and caring relationships and consistent routines. We use our expert subject knowledge to inspire and enthuse children, sparking curiosity and risk taking.

Key Stage 3 (Year 7 to Year 9) – National Curriculum delivered via the dynamic International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IB MYP)

Our curriculum and teaching seek to develop:

- Vocabulary, knowledge, skills, character and culture over the long term. We support this through our 'LAHC approach'; strategies that represent best practice throughout the curriculum.
- A culture in which students are independent, highly ambitious and achieve to the best of their ability, opening doors to a variety of future opportunities and enabling them to access further education and careers of their choice.
- A culture which expands students' perspectives through a range of spiritual, moral, social and cultural opportunities, creating globally aware young citizens with a sense of moral and social responsibility who also have the necessary IB Profile attributes to overcome the challenges they are likely to encounter in life.

All students, irrespective of their ability, study following suite of subjects at Key Stage 3:

Year 10 and Year 11 – GCSE Programme

Towards the conclusion of Year 9, students are carefully guided to choose their GCSE subjects. The structure of our curriculum means that all students do have the option of studying the English Baccalaureate suite of subjects.

All students study English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Sciences, Physical Education, PSHE and Citizenship.

Additional Provision

Instrumental tuition leading to Graded Music examinations is available for those pupils wishing to pursue excellence in Music.

In addition, all pupils will study Physical Education, PHSE & Citizenship, Philosophy & Ethics and work-related learning (non-examined).

Sixth Form Programme

Sixth Form at Leigh Academy Hugh Christie has something to offer all students, whatever their ability. As well as a full academic A level programme, we also offer a range of vocational courses at Level 3, including Level 3 BTEC and CTEC qualifications.

Beyond high quality teaching, our Sixth Form provides a comprehensive curriculum for students to ensure they stand out for their active citizenship, professional credibility, career development and personal skill-set so they can live happy, successful and rewarding lives after sixth form.

Our advisory structure at post 16 also mirrors our 'small schools' model in lower school and ensures that we can work closely with students, provide proactive support and bespoke opportunities.

Advisors meet students every morning and focus on key areas each day. Interleaving these areas with our PSHRE curriculum and careers provision means students embed these skills meaningfully so they are confident, assured and effective in their next steps.

At Leigh Academy Hugh Christie Sixth Form, we know that a 21st century education needs to prepare young people for a fast moving, global economy. We endeavour to develop their transferable skills so that they stand out in the workplace. We offer a range of extra-curricular societies and provision; we adjust these additional opportunities to cater to the needs of our incoming students so that we follow their areas of interest and career development plans.

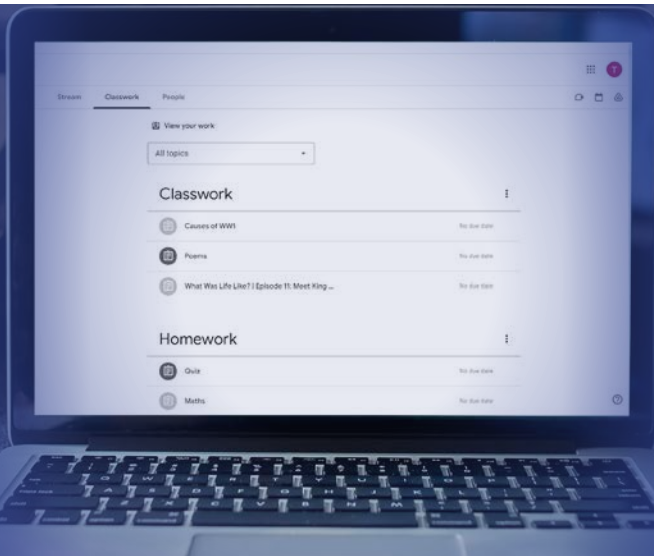

Digital Learning

Our digital curriculum will be underpinned by the principles of the IB MYP Programme and seamlessly embedded in all aspects of academy life through use of our 1:1 device scheme. All students receive a brand new Chromebook device at NO cost to their families.

The aim is to create learners who are highly competent in their use of technology and digitally literate. At Leigh Academy Hugh Christie, technology will not replace traditional teaching methodologies but instead will augment, and elevate the way that new content and skills are delivered, providing a rich and diverse learning experience for our students.

Technology will both bring the world into the classroom and transport students to any aspect of the globe they wish to explore; students of Leigh Academy Hugh Christie will leave us as global citizens already feeling they have travelled the world.

At our academy the technology is not being used for technology's sake but being implemented in lessons through a meticulously planned approach to ensure its use is highly pertinent, varied and creative. Technology use will enhance the learning and progress students make as they journey through the curriculum, supplementing their learning with development of their digital skills and digital literacy.



Beyond the Curriculum

While success in exams is important, Leigh Academy Hugh Christie believes in developing the whole person. We do this by providing a range of exciting opportunities both outside of and within the normal school curriculum.

This enhances the learning experience for all our pupils and includes opportunities to develop skills, visits, school productions, sports teams, the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and a Student Leadership Programme to name but a few.
